

Societies Ecobricks competition! Information Evening

What are Ecobricks? Ecobricks are large plastic bottles packed tightly with soft plastics. These plastic-filled bottles are very sturdy and can be used as building blocks for a wide range of things, for example furniture. Ecobricks are a sustainable way to sequester plastic that would otherwise be destined for landfill, or possibly end up in the ocean. We are currently encouraging University of Galway students and staff to make Ecobricks!

The Competition: Partaking societies will build a functional structure using ecobricks for the chance to win a cash prize. Societies can plan their structure until November, when the building will take place. Judging will take place on the 17th November at the Christmas Fest.

Regulations:

- The structure needs to be something functional, like a stool or table, but you can get creative!
- The structure needs to be made primarily from Ecobricks (>50%) • You need to use a minimum of 4 Ecobricks

Societies are encouraged to make and collect their own Ecobricks, but we will also distribute the ecobricks collected from the university
